


INTRODUCTION Governance & civil society










1375: The Chapter House

Something at stake ← → something to trade






Duke of Lancaster re: Commons in Chapter House







Small political distance & large political invention




Notes:1) MPs came from Eng & Wales & later from Scotland, so this is only a very rough guide to political distance.


Late 20th Century Dev't Stages


